
A long road for economic recovery

Pension overhaul is crucial for rebalancing public accounts, but **it is not enough** for resuming Brazil's growth

Expenses with the pension system represent **52% of the federal budget**









It takes 20.5 days to start a business in Brazil


World average is 20.12 days

Note: the numbers go up and down due to index methodological changes throughout the years





Key issues according to Brazilians (%)





President Bolsonaro and House Speaker Rodrigo Maia the day the pension reform bill was delivered by the Executive branch to Congress



Political party composition


