



Sweden has officially become the Western military alliance's 32nd member. That leaves only four EU member countries now out of the club — Ireland, Malta, Austria and Cyprus.




*Iceland has not officially withdrawn its EU application, but in 2015 its government requested that *Iceland should not be regarded as a candidate country for EU membership.*
