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
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
Young People Prefer to Use Digital Media for Their News

Please select any of the following sources that you regularly watch or visit for news or current events?






What a Difference a Percentage Point Makes: The Impact of Slight Variations in Sample Composition on Election Polling Results






Population of Current US Generations



Two Youngest Generations Projected to Be Majority of Electorate by 2028




Plurals Are the First "Majority-Minority" Generation in US History


Plurals are the Least Religious and Least Christian Generation in US History



Young Voters Strongly Suupport Democratic Values Like Individual Freedom





Young Voters Also Support Democratic Values such as Inclusion and Tolerance





Women In All Age Groups More Likely To Vote For Harris Than Men





Gender Gap Is Greatest Among Older Voters


