STATE AND FEDERAL ADVOCACY

Gun violence prevention issues that overlap with Fed and State

- Funding for Community Violence Interruption (CVI), research
- ATF funding
- Dealer licensing

General Fed and State overlap

- Bipartisanship
- Kids, Veterans, Over 65
- Law enforcement, Faith groups, Constituents



LOCAL AND STATE ADVOCACY

With local municipalities preempted from passing gun safety laws in 42 states, we have been pushed to work creatively, and consider overlapping advocacy priorities and opportunities.

Local → **State Strategies**

- Elevating local voices to pass gun safety laws or stop harmful legislation
- Directing law enforcement expertise to inform bill language
- Expanding successful local programs statewide
- Mitigating harm or providing tools for successful implementation legislation locally

State → **Local Strategies**

- Allocating state funding to support local CVI or secure storage education programs
- Passing state legislation for local implementation
- Passing bills with preemption carve outs

CASE STUDY: FEDERAL BACKGROUND CHECK LOOPHOLE AKA ENGAGED IN THE BUSINESS RULE

Bipartisan Safer Communities Act (BSCA)

- First bipartisan gun violence prevention law to pass Congress in 30 years
- Needed state advocacy to get over the hump

Engaged in the Business

- A part of BSCA
- Congressional Review Act was brought forward in the House and Senate
- Even though we knew a veto would be the end we still worked on BSCA Rs and moderate Ds
- Emphasized responsible gun ownership and law enforcement support



CASE STUDY: MITIGATING THE DAMAGE OF ARMING TEACHERS LOCALLY

Before Passage

- Engaged bipartisan partners with overlapping interests
- Ensured stakeholders were informed and had tools to voice their concerns

Following Passage

- District commitment tracking to hold state and local leaders accountable
- Volunteers toolkits to advocate to school districts and city leaderships
- Continuous media coverage to promote transparency and constituent engagement
