


Exactly who makes the laws?

EXCLUSIVE (EU)


e.g. trade, competition

Exclusive competence


- Trade

- National contributions
- Custom duties
- Value-added tax
- Non-recycled plastic packaging waste contribution
- Fines imposed when businesses fail to comply with EU rules

Security and Defence	14.9


