# Connect before launching project:

- Faith leaders, educators, small business owners
- Local elected officials

- Co-create initiatives to align with community needs
- Build trust through early collaboration

### Tailoring Philanthropy vs. One-Size-Fits-All

Every community has unique needs

Ask directly:
What will make a
difference here?

- Avoid cookie-cutter
   CSR programs
- Ensure contributions are relevant and impactful

### Communication Channels & Feedback Loops

Establish ongoing, transparent communication:

- Project-specific website
- Regular op-eds in local papers/newsletters
- HOA facebook or community posts

Encourage two-way communication

## Local Monitoring and Rapid Response

Identify local champions to monitor sentiment

Set up a clear escalation process:

Questions ) (Internal review) (Timely proportional response)

Helps prevent small issues from becoming crises

Builds early trust

Reduces rumors and misinformation

Identifies emerging concerns quickly

Turns passive observers into active supporters
