

## What is ALPA-PAC checkoff (PCO)?

**A**LPAC checkoff (PCO) is a voluntary payroll-deduction plan that allows U.S. ALPA members to contribute to the PAC on a regular basis through an automatic donation directly from their paychecks. ALPA members only sign up for checkoff once to start contributing to ALPA-PAC. These contributions can be changed or terminated at any time online.

Over 90% of ALPA-PAC donations come through checkoff. Signing up for a recurring contribution like checkoff allows ALPA-PAC to budget more accurately and effectively. Your participation in PCO also means fewer e-mails from ALPA-PAC, as we know you are committed to supporting our pilot-partisan efforts. PCO also saves the PAC money on administrative costs, so your contributions go further. It is the *easiest and best way* to show your support for pilot-partisan issues on Capitol Hill.

## What is ALPA-PAC?

**A**LPA-PAC is your political voice in D.C. and across the country. Funded 100% by voluntary contributions from ALPA members, the PAC works to build a pilot-partisan government.

The legislation Congress crafts has a direct and lasting impact on ALPA members and their families. ALPA-PAC was created as a tool to help represent your concerns to the Members of Congress working on pilot-partisan issues on a daily basis. The PAC serves as a critical complement to ALPA's lobbying and grassroots efforts and greatly helps to educate legislators on the real-life implications of their decisions.

## Where does ALPA-PAC support go?

**A**LPA-PAC funds go towards educating and building relationships with decision makers in Washington, D.C. ALPA-PAC is the most **bipartisan** labor PAC in the country. We regularly publish a list of supported candidates and causes at [ALPAPAC.org](http://ALPAPAC.org) so you are able to stay engaged and informed.

In part because of ALPA-PAC's **nonpartisan** approach, pilots can rely on support from both sides of the aisle whenever aviation issues are discussed. Supporting both Republicans and Democrats has enabled ALPA to succeed regardless of the political climate.

Thanks in part to ALPA-PAC, Members of Congress look to us on aviation issues. They want to know where we stand and how they can help; that's good for you!

## Who else has a PAC?

**T**here are more than 16,000 PACs in D.C. representing everyone from unions and trade groups to corporations and holding companies. Many airlines have PACs of their own, as do other trade associations representing their interests. They use their PACs to forward their legislative agenda in Washington, D.C., every day.

With so many competing interests, it's not only necessary that we have a PAC to represent ALPA pilots, but also that our PAC be well-funded. While ALPA might not be the largest union in the country, ALPA-PAC allows us to fly higher than our competitors and raise our issues above the noise.

## Do ALPA-PAC efforts succeed?

**A**bsolutely! Since it was established, ALPA-PAC has frequently been the difference between victory and defeat for pilot concerns on Capitol Hill.

For example, ALPA-PAC has worked to prevent taxes on your employer-provided healthcare benefits; to require the Federal Aviation Administration to establish One Level of Safety and Security across all commercial airline operations; and to strengthen rules limiting foreign control and ownership of our airlines. Our list of accomplishments continues to grow. ALPA-PAC fights constantly to protect the jobs and earning potential of U.S. airline pilots.
