PathNET provides pathologists with multiple ways to influence Congress and state capitals, including:

- Hosting a congressional laboratory tour
- Attending congressional fly-ins
- Sending letters to members of Congress
- Conducting meetings with members of Congress in the district
- Participating in conference calls regarding issue updates and action alerts
- Attending the CAP Policy Meeting

The CAP's Washington, DC, office will work with you to facilitate any of these activities.

Influence Policy

The CAP Action Center (capactioncenter.aristotle.com) provides a powerful advocacy tool for grassroots pathologists.

Once in the Action Center, PathNET members can email their elected representative directly with only a few mouse clicks.

Host a Congressional Laboratory Tour

Since 2000, the CAP has helped PathNET members host more than 300 laboratory tours for House and Senate members. A laboratory tour is the single best way to advocate for pathology. These tours help to put a face on the profession and demonstrate pathology's key role in the overall delivery of quality health care. After touring a pathology laboratory and seeing first-hand what pathologists do on a daily basis, a lawmaker comes away with a better understanding of pathology issues.
