### General Information

### 1. How did I get appointed to the county Farm Bureau Candidate Evaluation Committee (CEC)?

All members of the CEC were appointed by their County Farm Bureau Board of Directors.

### 2. What is the purpose of the Candidate Evaluation Committees?

CEC's will evaluate state and national candidates who, if elected or reelected to public office, will represent all or a portion of their county. Following their evaluation, the Committees will decide which candidate, for a specific public office, to recommend for an AgriPac endorsement.

#### 3. What information will AgriPac provide to help Candidate Evaluation Committees with their evaluations?

AgriPac will send a questionnaire to all candidates from Michigan who have filed to run for Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, U.S. Senate, U.S. House of Representatives, Michigan State Senate, Michigan House of Representatives, MSU Board of Trustees and State Supreme Court. AgriPac will provide vote records and staff comments of incumbents seeking reelection or election to another public office.

### 4. How will the Candidate Evaluation Committees receive this information?

- The deadline for candidates to mail their questionnaires to Michigan Farm Bureau offices is May 4. AgriPac will e-mail CEC chairs, county presidents, and County Administrative Managers (CAM's) candidate questionnaires once they are received.
- Updated vote records will be mailed to CEC chairs, county presidents and CAMs. Additionally, current and past vote records are available on the MFB website.
- Confidential staff comments will be mailed to CEC Chairs on April 25.

### 5. What are the deadlines for Candidate Evaluation Committees to complete the evaluations and send their endorsement recommendations to AgriPac?

The absolute deadline for CEC's to send their candidate endorsement recommendations to AgriPac is May 25. Recommendations can be mailed, emailed, or faxed.

### 6. How will Candidate Evaluation Committees know who the candidates are and which legislative districts are within their county?

Information on how to look up which candidates file for election in each legislative District will be mailed to CEC Chairs and CAMs no later than April 25. Legislative District maps for the U.S. House of Representatives, State House of Representatives and State Senate can be found on Pages 5-7.

### 7. How will the endorsement recommendations be forwarded to AgriPac?

CEC's will express their endorsement recommendations on the form that is included on pages 2 & 3 of this handbook. Question 6 on the form is very important. Please include reasons on why you're making the recommendation. The recommendation is not an endorsement. Endorsements are made by AgriPac.

### 8. What will AgriPac do with the Candidate Evaluation Committee recommendations?

The recommendations will be reviewed very carefully by AgriPac; they are an important factor in AgriPac's candidate endorsement decisions. The AgriPac Committee may contact the CEC Chair for additional information and may also interview the candidates before any endorsement is made.

### 9. When will AgriPac meet to make its candidate endorsement decisions?

AgriPac will meet June 7, at the Farm Bureau Center in Lansing to decide which candidates to endorse for the August 7 Primary Election.

### 10. Will Candidate Evaluation Committees be informed of the AgriPac endorsements?

Yes. A confidential and complete list of the candidates endorsed by AgriPac will be sent to CEC chairs, County Farm Bureau Presidents, County Farm Bureau Administrative Managers, MFB Board of Directors and Regional Representatives on June 8. The endorsements will not be public at this time. See next question.

### 11. When will AgriPac endorsements be released to the candidates and general public?

Letters will be sent by AgriPac to the candidates endorsed, along with any contributions to their campaigns, beginning June 14 to inform them of their endorsement for election to the public office they are seeking. On June 15, AgriPac will publicly announce the candidates endorsed to news media.

#### 12. Is AgriPac nonpartisan?

Yes. It is the policy of AgriPac to influence the nomination and election of qualified candidates who have demonstrated basic beliefs and/or actions which are consistent with MFB policy regardless of their political affiliation. AgriPac is nonpartisan. In evaluating candidates it is very important to set partisan politics aside and be completely objective.

### 13. If a Candidate Evaluation Committee needs answers to specific questions or more information, who should they contact?





## CRITERIA FOR DESIGNATING Friends of Agriculture"

### The following criteria will be followed by AgiPac in designating "Friends of Agriculture."

- 1. Results of input from county Farm Bureau Candidate Evaluation Committees
- 2. Recognition of the importance of agriculture to the economy
- 3. Demonstrated interest in agricultural issues and possible solutions to such issues
- 4. Position on issues that impact agriculture
- 5. Integrity and dedication to the campaign
- 6. Involvement of agricultural persons in the campaign
- 7. Vote records (incumbents)
- 8. Staff Comments (incumbents)

## SUGGESTIONS FOR COUNTY FARM BUREAU Candidate Evaluation Committees

- 1. Plan ahead. Set a timetable for candidate evaluations and making endorsement recommendations to AgriPac. Timing is critical due to the tight timetable. See the 2018 Candidate Endorsement Timetable (page 4) for assistance in establishing the plan.
- 2. Conduct candidate interviews and, contact the candidates early to make interview appointments. When the interviews are held, all the candidates seeking the same office should be invited. Interview each candidate separately. Give each candidate equal time and ask each candidate the same questions.
- 3. Be nonpartisan in evaluating candidates and making endorsement recommendations.
- 4. On question 6 on the recommendation form document specific reasons for recommending or not recommending an AgriPac endorsement for each candidate. Reasons for why your CEC is making a certain recommendation is very valuable to the AgriPac Committee.
- 5. Endorsement recommendations should be submitted to the County Farm Bureau President for review before mailing to AgriPac. The County President is required to sign the recommendation form.
- 6. Send endorsement recommendations to the AgriPac Committee by the established deadline, May 25.

# WE NEED MORE FARMERS TO RUN FOR OFFICE
