




Disbursements by Party



Chairman's Challenge

In 2014, we implemented a new program called the Government Affairs Chairman's Challenge. The goal of the program was to increase NECA member involvement in grassroots and the PAC. We challenged each of the 119 NECA chapters across the United States to host a Member of Congress either at a NECA contractor's place of business, jobsite, or NECA Chapter office. The outcome was a great success, with 33 site visits in 2014 compared to only 10 in 2013. The site visits either created or expanded on our members' relationships with Members of Congress. It gave them an opportunity to discuss NECA's policy positions and showed Members of Congress first-hand how these issues impact the electrical construction industry.


