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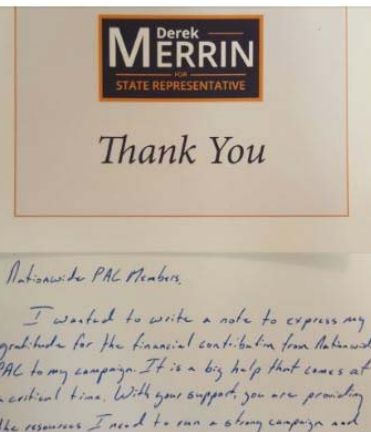
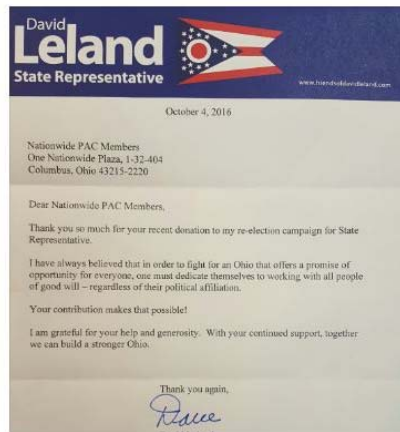

This weekend, John Glenn was honored in Columbus for his life of service to our country. A combat fighter pilot, the first American to orbit the Earth, a U.S. Senator from Ohio for almost 25 years, and the oldest human to fly in space, Mr. Glenn lay in repose in the Ohio Statehouse rotunda Friday before a celebration of his life was held on Ohio State's campus on Saturday. The event was attended by Vice President Biden and Ohio Governor Kasich, among other dignitaries. He will be buried at Arlington National Cemetery in a private ceremony. John Glenn was the recipient of the first ever Nationwide PAC contribution and NPAC thanks him for his lifetime of dedicated service!

It's Inauguration Day! Today, Donald Trump will take the oath of office as the 45th President of the United States. But after the ceremony and parade, it's all about the parties! The first inaugural ball was in 1789, at President Washington's first inauguration, and about 300 people attended. James Buchanan's inaugural ball featured 400 gallons of oysters and 1,200 quarts of ice cream. As the years have gone on, there have been more and more balls to attend. The Clintons hold the record for most balls attended: 14 in 1997. The Obamas attended 10 in 2009. With so many to attend, presidents and first ladies don't spend a lot of time at each: President George W. Bush spent an average of 29 to 56 seconds dancing at each of the balls he attended in 2001.
