Board Oversight

- GGF Board Article of Organization and By-Laws
 - Outlines Various Roles and Duties of Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary and Treasurer
 - Sets clear expectations about GGF Board Appointments and Terms of Service
- GGF Duties
 - Once per cycle, approve line-by-line federal budget in accordance with outlined by-laws
 - Approve a total amount for State and Local budgets
 - Receive quarterly updates and make additional approvals only when maxing or outside of established guidelines
 - Coordinate the solicitation of employee contributions



Setting Expectations

1. Serve on at least 1 sub-committee of the GGF Board.
 1. Retiree Solicitation
 2. Donor Rewards and Recognition
 3. PAC Match
 4. Employee Education Program
 5. Solicitation Campaign Execution
2. Invite 2 PAC-eligible employees to a GGF-sponsored event.
3. Host 3 “Ice Cream Pints and Politics” during solicitation campaign.
4. Send 4 personalized communications during the solicitation campaign.
5. Recruit 5 PAC Pals within the Company to help facilitate participation in employee solicitation.
