Survey of Federal and State Lobbying Laws

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Lobby registration rules tend to fall into three categories. Those that require registration and reporting for:

Category I legislative lobbying only (including executive approval or disapproval of legislation);

Category II legislative lobbying and executive branch lobbying which is limited to influencing a rule, regulation, rate-making proceeding, or policy; and

Category III legislative lobbying and executive branch lobbying which includes efforts to influence all non-ministerial official actions of the executive branch, including but not limited to the approval of financial arrangements on behalf of the governmental entity.

Lobby registration rules tend to fall into three categories. Those that require registration and reporting for:

Category I	legislative lobbying only (including executive approval or disapproval of legislation);
Category	registative toobying only (including executive approval of disapproval of registation),

Category II

legislative lobbying and executive approval of disapproval of legislation);
legislative lobbying and executive branch lobbying which is limited to influencing a rule, regulation, rate-making proceeding, or policy; and legislative lobbying and executive branch lobbying which includes efforts to influence all non-ministerial official actions of the executive branch, including but Category III not limited to the approval of financial arrangements on behalf of the governmental entity.

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
