- Untapped resource
 - Orthopaedic PAC Resident Participation
 - 2009 Resident Participation: Non-Existent
 - 2014 Resident participation: 85 residents
 - 2016 Resident Participation: 330 residents
 - Orthopaedic PAC Residency Programs
 - 2016: 8 at 100%, 54 programs participating



- Invitation to Capitol Club events, such as the reception at the National Orthopaedic Leadership Conference (NOLC) and similar events throughout the year; and
- Leadersnip Conference (NOLC) and similar events throughout the year, and Each individual's name will be listed in the PAC annual report, on the PAC website and at the PAC/Advocacy booth at the annual meeting.

Residents are eligible for inclusion into the Futures Capitol Club by meeting any of the following criteria:

- \$100 donation in one calendar year
- \$250 in total contributions during residency
- Donation of any amount to the PAC for four years in a row during residency
 A donation of \$25 and a 'grand rounds' talk to your residency about advocacy
- A donation of s25 and a 'grand rounds' taik to your residency about advocacy'.






