EU Institutions over the past 5 years

- European Commission
 - o "Big on big things, small on small things" (J.C. Juncker, 2014)
 - EC is now more political, less technocratic




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 about flexing its muscles and raising its voice (e.g. tax, PEST)



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- European Council
 - Increasingly important to engage with EU capitals



The landscape is more complex & more political: change/elections are coming



A new 'Brexit' world

- Challenges...
 - A new power balance at the negotiation table and new dynamics for EU legislation & regulation
 - Monitoring is critical (things can move quickly!)
 - How will you allocate resources?
- ...and Opportunities
 - UK-EU relations: Position yourself now
 - UK-based companies need to bolster their EU presence
