





1. The Ordinary Legislative Procedure








Differences between Comitology Committees and Expert Groups

Comitology has a limited scope: control of the implementing powers of the Commission

Comitology committees always created by the legislator

Comitology committees composed of all Member States

Opinions delivered by comitology committees have a direct impact on the decision-making process Expert groups: advice and expertise to the Commission for the preparation of legislative proposals, policy initiatives and delegated acts, as well as for the implementation of existing legislation

Expert groups normally established by the Commission. In some cases – which should be the exception - set up by the legislator

Expert groups may be composed of individuals, organisations in the broad sense of the word and Member States' authorities


Opinions of expert groups cannot bind the Commission
