

- Moreno will request loans from international organizations such as the World Bank to finance Ecuadorian companies.
- IMF calculates that the country will [decrease 6.3%](#)

	Circulation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> "Todos en Casa" government repatriation plan will be extended for two more weeks as flights are coordinated for the return of Uruguay's citizens throughout the globe.

	Health	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> More technological strategies are being used to contain the virus as well as a free telephonic line to resolve questions and requests regarding coronavirus matters.
